**Help your child get ready to learn to read!**

Each day features a fun activity that will help your child build pre-reading skills. Activities are color-coded by skill. Ask your children's librarian for more ideas on how to promote early literacy skills with daily activities at home.

**1 Songs**  
It's Pig Day. Did you know pigs sing to their children? Sing one of your favorite songs to your child.

**2 Reading**  
It's Read Across America Day. Help your child pick out his favorite book and read it together with him.

**3 Science**  
Visit your local library and ask for book recommendations on famous women in science to celebrate Women's History Month.

**4 Songs**  
Together with your child, make up a song about the famous women you both read about yesterday.

**5 Rhymes**  
How many words can you and your child think of that rhyme with "spring"?

**6 Writing**  
Ask your child to draw a picture of a four-leaf clover.

**7 Math**  
On Cereal Day, take a cup of cereal and have your child count the pieces.

**8 Play**  
Build a reading fort together with your child using couch cushions and blankets.

**9 Sounds**  
Take a walk with your child and listen for different birds. Ask her what she hears.

**10 Stories**  
It's Mario Day. Encourage your child to tell you a story about spending a day in the Mushroom Kingdom with Mario and his friends.

**11 Math**  
It's officially Daylight Saving Time. Ask your child how many hours the clocks sprung ahead yesterday.

**12 Science**  
It's Plant a Flower Day. Plant a flower in a pot and put it next to a window. Then, measure its growth together!

**13 Reading**  
Embrace the warmer weather ahead and read *Spring for Sophie* by Yael Werber, illustrated by Jen Hill.

**14 Writing**  
It's Pi Day. Celebrate 3.14 and pie by encouraging your child to list all the different pies that he can think of in three minutes and fourteen seconds.

**15 Science**  
Visit your local library and check out a nonfiction book about your child's favorite animal.

**16 Rhymes**  
How many words can you and your child think of that rhyme with "green"?

**17 Play**  
It's Saint Patrick's Day. Head outside and see if you and your child can catch a leprechaun together.

**18 Play**  
Bubble Week starts this week! Blow some bubbles together with your child and watch them float away.

**19 Sounds**  
Spring is here! Take a walk with your child outside and listen to the different sounds.

**20 Stories**  
Ask your child what she would do if she landed on a different planet as an astronaut.

**21 Reading**  
To celebrate Poetry Day, read a poem with your child.

**22 Math**  
Head outside with your child and measure the height of a tree or bush. How tall is it?

**23 Sounds**  
To celebrate Puppy Day, ask your child what noise a dog makes. A big dog? A little dog?

**24 Rhymes**  
Create a simple poem with your child about what he loves about spring.

**25 Math**  
Hide pictures of four-leaf clovers around your home and send your child on a scavenger hunt. Ask her to count how many she finds.

**26 Stories**  
To celebrate Make Up Your Own Holiday Day, encourage your child to make up his own holiday. How does he plan to celebrate?

**27 Writing**  
Ask your child to draw a picture of the Easter bunny.

**28 Play**  
Play hide-and-seek with your child and talk about who found the best hiding spots.

**29 Sounds**  
Visit a local park with your child. What do you both see and hear?

**30 Songs**  
Create a song with your child about the end of March.

**31 Writing**  
Encourage your child to draw pictures using her favorite crayon color.
